147 Pianos was produced as an experimental documentary of this single performance in October 2013 at Lukas Piano Service on Chicago's west side where 200 musicians, pros and amateurs, adults and children played a myriad of scores from Chopsticks to Chopin all together, all at once. The film interweaves interviews with the owners Ed Lisauskas and Sylvester Czajkowski who have worked together for decades, fixing and tuning pianos, in a dusty warehouse full of at least 150 rickety but mostly living pianos with a few treasures they have refurbished. They struggle to maintain their lifelong business threatened with the ever-growing preference for digital media and the necessity of portability in our contemporary world.
